Grease Fire Damages Apartment

A fire in a Jane Court apartment did approximately \$35,000 in damage and claimed the life of a family dog Sunday, July 6.

Russ Wyse, Archbold Fire Department assistant chief, said a grease fire started in the kitchen at 12 Jane Court, apartment No. 1, the residence of Amy Mock and her daughter.

Wyse said the doors and windows were closed, and the family was outside. Family members heard popping and cracking noises, opened the kitchen door on the south side of the building, and discovered the fire.

Archbold Fire Departed was called to the scene at 12:03 pm. Wyse, who was in charge of the fire scene, said the first crew to arrive went into the apartment through the kitchen door, and using a 1 1/2-inch line, knocked down the flames.

"They knocked it down real quick," Wyse said.

A second crew at the front door was ready to go in, and a third crew was on the roof, ready to cut ventilation holes;

More Theft Reports In Archbold

There were four theft reports in the village of Archbold last week, two of which are similar to previous reports.

Martin Schmidt, Archbold Police chief, said the thefts could be connected.

In one case, a thief entered an occupied residence and stole audio equipment from a truck; in another case, an in-dash car stereo was taken.

Value: \$1,000.

Grieser
Schmidt said a thief entered the home of Chad Grieser, 212 Farmington Road, between 11:30 pm, Saturday, June 28, and 6 am, Sunday June 29.

Grieser was at home at the time, Schmidt said.

The thief took a video game console, three game controllers, 15 games, 35 digital video discs, and set of car keys.

The thief also got into Grieser's truck and took a car stereo amplifier and two 16-inch subwoofers.

Value: \$885.

An aftermarket in-dash car stereo was stolen from a sport-utility vehicle owned by Ann Gracia, 216 Meadow Road, while parked at her residence.

That theft occurred sometime between 10:30 p.m. that same Saturday and 11 am the following day.

There were two other theft reports. Mike Rosebrook, rural Archbold, reported while he was working in Memorial Park, he left a digital music player in the dugout at the baseball field. When he returned, the unit, valued at \$250, was gone.

That theft occurred between 3 pm and 6 pm, Thursday, July 3.

Tami Thompson, Defiance, told police about \$200 in cash

Lock

Police reports say the thefts were from unlocked vehicles, or make no reference to whether the vehicles were locked. There were no signs of forced entry at the Grieser home.

Schmidt said he believes the thefts are crimes of opportunity. The thief isn't planning to strike a particular target; when the door is open, they take what they can.

but the first crew reported the fire was out, so the second crew and ventilation were not needed.

The kitchen suffered fire damage, and there was smoke and heat damage to the rest of the apartment. Neither of the other two apartments in the building were damaged.

He estimated \$30,000 in damage to the building, and \$5,000 to the contents.

Wyse said the building is owned by Scott Lantz, Wauseon.

Most of what's taken has been aftermarket in-dash car stereos. Schmidt said the thief is able to remove the stereos without damaging the dash.

The best defense, Schmidt said, is to lock the doors.

"It's no guarantee that it will keep someone out, but it might keep an opportunist from making entry," he said.—David Pugh

Brief death notices are published in the Archbold Buckeye at no charge to the family of the deceased.

Included in the free notice is the name of the deceased, age, place of residence or former residence, date of death, immediate family survivors, memorial/funeral service (if the funeral is upcoming), burial information, and the name of the funeral home (if the funeral is upcoming).

A paid obituary includes all of the information given above as well as any other information the family wishes to be published. Such items can include the names of all grandchildren, great-grandchildren, pets, and others dear to the deceased. The family of the deceased might want to include club, church, veteran, and other organizations. Paid obituaries can include information about memorials for the deceased.

Prepayment is required, unless the obituary is placed through a funeral home that is billed directly.

Obituaries are charged at the discounted rate of \$7.40 per column inch (a column inch is 1.83 inches wide by one inch tall). A tribute that is 1 column wide by 5 inches in length will cost \$37. A photo is an additional \$5.
