## Archbold Boys Finish Seventh At Delta Invite

The Archbold cross country teams ran in the rain and mud at the Delta Cross Country Invitational, Saturday Sept. 13.

The Blue Streak boys placed seventh out of 18 teams with 238 points. Delta won with a low score of 62. Lenawee Christian was second with 95; Fayette rounded out the top three with 120.

The AHS girls didn't have enough runners to score as a team. Anthony Wayne captured the girls title with a low score of 47 points. Wauseon had 56; rounding out the top three was Blissfield, with 128.

The Archbold volleyball team went on a tear last week, winning all four of their matches to raise their record to 7-1, 4-0 in the Northwest Ohio Athletic League.

The Streaks opened the week with a 25-23, 25-19, 25-11 league victory at Patrick Henry, Tuesday, Sept. 9. They followed with a 25-6, 25-14, 25-18 NWOAL victory over Bryan, Thursday, Sept. 11.

In a Saturday, Sept. 13 trimatch at Napoleon with the Wildcats and Fairview, the Streaks beat the Apaches 25-19, 25-13 before disposing of the host 25-13, 25-21.
