Pettisville School Board Hires Jacinta Nafziger As New Guidance Counselor

The Pettisville School Board has named Jacinta Nafziger as the new guidance counselor of the school district.

Nafziger replaces Dave Ripke, who retired.

The action came during a special Pettisville Local School District board meeting, Wednesday, June 24.

Nafziger, an Archbold High School graduate, holds a bachelor's degree from Eastern Mennonite University, Harrisonburg, Va., and a master's degree in guidance and counseling from George Fox University, Portland, Ore.

A supplemental contract was approved for Rebecca Dorosz to serve as the PHS junior varsity volleyball coach.

Two support staff contracts also were approved: for Kelly McDermott, bus driver, and Chrissy Stuckey, cafeteria. Both were approved for two-year contracts.

Pettisville students Dillon Weirauch and Michael Burkholder were approved for summer custodial hourly help, as needed.

The board approved Andrew Switzer to serve as a volunteer tech assistant for the summer.

The board approved purchasing an insurance package from the Schools of Ohio Risk Sharing Authority (SORSA) for the 2010 school year. SORSA will provide liability, vehicle fleet, and building insurance for \$16,913.

SORSA bid a total coverage of \$11 million in liability coverage.

The other bidder, Ohio Casualty Insurance, would only bid a maximum of \$5 million in total liability for \$20,815.

Board members voted to sell the two modular classroom units to Taylor Classroom Sales, Toledo, for \$7,600. The units will be removed by the end of July.

Jason Waldvogel, elementary principal, reported that the Read TEAM program had a successful year.

Twenty-five students participated. Of them, 23 were able to raise their instructional reading level. Two improved by four reading levels, and seven improved by three levels.

Waldvogel commended the 69 mentors who served in the reading program during the past school year. They donated 1,350

hours to help students improve reading skills.

He said Pettisville received the Gold Award Level from the Buckeye Best Healthy Schools award program. Waldvogel recognized Brenda Aeschliman, Pettisville cafeteria supervisor, and the health and physical education teachers for helping the school reach the top level.

All votes were unanimous. Tom Beck, board member, was absent.

The next school board meeting is Monday, July 13, 7:30 p.m. in the school library.—*D.J. Neuenschwander*

Library Fiscal Officer Explains Resignation

Laura Hutchison, Archbold Community Library fiscal officer, said there were several factors behind her decision to resign.

Her letter of resignation was accepted at a special board meeting, Wednesday, June 17.

The reason for her resignation was not discussed during the meeting.

In a later interview, Hutchison said her husband, who is retired, has purchased a winter home in Florida. She would like time off to travel between the two. She had planned to leave the job in October.

She said on June 3, she was given "a harsh evaluation" by her superiors, "and I decided to quit to allow the library to hire someone else."

"I just felt they were overboard in what they complained about. The errors that were made were all fixable," she said.

"I feel Archbold is fortunate to have such a beautiful library, with a wonderful staff to help patrons," she said

Archbold Businesses Pass Alcohol Check

None of the Archbold businesses that sell alcoholic beverages sold such drinks to a trained underage informant as part of a countywide compliance check.

The Ohio Investigative Unit, a division of the Ohio Department of Public Safety, conducted the checks in May.

Of the 30 businesses that sell alcohol, six received citations for selling to an underage person.

Cited: Fayette—Buckboard Bar & Grill, Circle K; Lyons—Main Stop; Wauseon—Kam Wah Restaurant, Shell Gas Station, Wal-Mart.

During the checks, informants attempt to purchase alcohol while an OIU officer waits outside, away from the view of those inside the store.

Stated purpose of the checks is to ensure that local retailers with liquor licenses are requiring proper identification to make sure they are selling alcohol only to 21 and over, in compliance with state law.

Local businesses checked

were: Archbold Main Stop, Archbold SuperValu, Circle K, Friendship Food Mart, Ickey's, Nu-Arch Lanes, Pamida.

The compliance checks were conducted in conjunction with the "Parents Who Host, Lose the Most" campaign, through the Partnership for a Drug-Free Fulton County.
